When you finish your literature circle book pick one task to complete as a group.

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>PowerPoint Presentation</b></p> <p>Create a PowerPoint that includes a summary of the story; an analysis of the text structure; a visual and written reflection of the story; and 10 pictures that represent the story (explain the representations). The PowerPoint should be interactive and include special effects. Present the PowerPoint to your classmates.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Movie Director</b></p> <p>You are the director of the movie for your book. Cast a movie star who would best play the character for each character in the book. Find pictures of the actors and add them to your book. Choose 10 scenes in the book and find pictures of places that would best represent the setting. Select three scenes and write (typed) scripts with dialogue and director's notes. Put all of your "movie" information together in a "director's" booklet. Show and explain your book.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Video Production</b></p> <p>Select one scene in the book for this task. You will write (typed) a "movie" script. You will make a movie of the scene using actors (the people in your group or helpers in your class). You must consider the setting, costumes, light, and sound. Add special effects and edit your movie in a program like Microsoft Movie Maker. Show the movie to your classmates.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Magazine</b></p> <p>You will create a magazine that represents your book. Include a cover, table of contents, 4 nonfiction articles, 4 fiction pieces, 2 poems, 5 advertisements, one "fun" page (puzzles, crosswords, arts &amp; crafts, recipes, etc.), and 4 pages of your choosing. Your magazine should have a minimum of 18 pages. Show and explain your magazine. Read some of the pieces to the class. Create an extra copy for the class library.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Website</b></p> <p>Create a website that represents the book. The website must be 10 pages deep. Each page must reflect a different aspect of the book. The pages must be content rich, visually appealing, and include pictures (illustrations or free clip art). Include fiction and nonfiction content. Include links to other sites with information and activities that can be used with the book. Show your website to your class.</p> <p>*Students can create ad free, password protected websites at <a href="http://www.think.com/en_us/">http://www.think.com/en_us/</a></p> <p>Your teacher will need to assist you in setting up your site.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Poetry Book</b></p> <p>Your task is to write, edit, and publish a poetry book. Each poem must represent the book in some way. You must include at least 25 poems. Each poem must be typed. You may include illustrations. Your book must include a cover, a publishing page, a title page, and the poetry pages. Upload your book to <a href="https://www.pdfonline.com/convert_pdf.asp">https://www.pdfonline.com/convert_pdf.asp</a> in order to create a PDF file. You will need an email address to retrieve the file. Ask your teacher for help. Print off the file and bind your poetry book. Read your poetry book to the class. Create an extra copy for the class library.</p>
